State Parks Now Open for Season

Forty-five thousand acres of forest land, state owned, was thrown open to outdoor lovers in Pennsylvania last Friday, as the department of forests and waters started another tourist season.

The state lands will remain open until Sept. 30th.

The state parks are available for camping, for weekly rentals, monthly, or all season use, and even for overnight camping, but permission must be procured and rentals advanced. The state has 167 cabins scattered over the state also available to be rented.

The state advertises 5,000 miles of fishing waters within state forests and park areas. There are 40 lakes, ponds and dams on the state lands open to visitors.

Last year the state was host to 4,300,000 persons who visited the state parks or who camped there or participated in picnics.

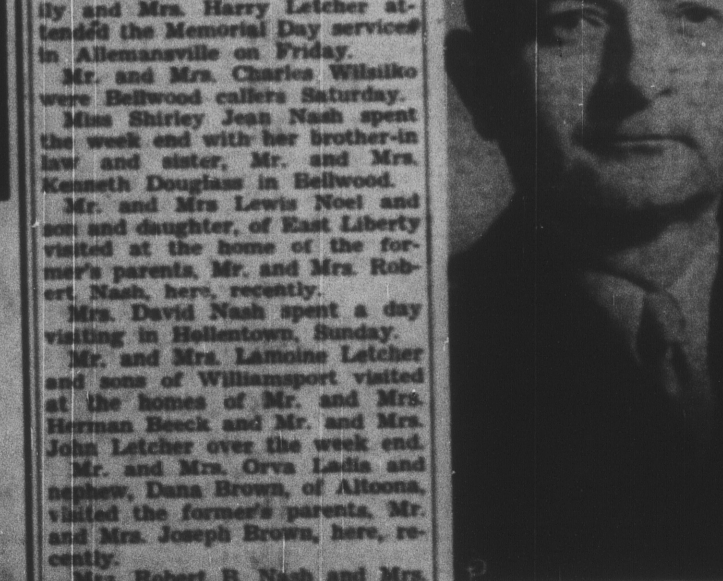
