Cheryl Robinson of Short Street, who has been hospitalized for the past few weeks in the Altoona City Hospital, has returned to her home.

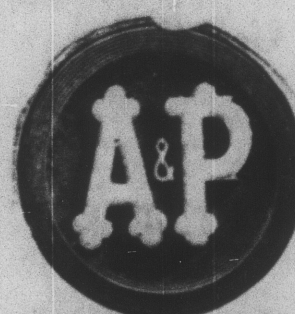
Mr. and Mrs. John W. Rose, of Jackson Street, were recent callers in Beaver Falls. Their son, Paul, will be married June 25.
