

injuries or the month was 9 to per cent higher than the preceding month but 7.9 per cent lower than in the corresponding month

last year.

Iron and steel reported more injuries than any other industry—1301 or 16.7 per cent of the monthly total.

Power working machines were the agency most frequently associated with these accidents, accounting for 213 of the cases.

Construction and contracting with \$40 injuries, or 12 per cent of the total, led the non-manufacturing industries. Hand tools and working surfaces were the most common agencies in these accidents, involving 245 cases.
