

ASHVILLE Party Held Here Sunday Honors Mrs. Gallagher

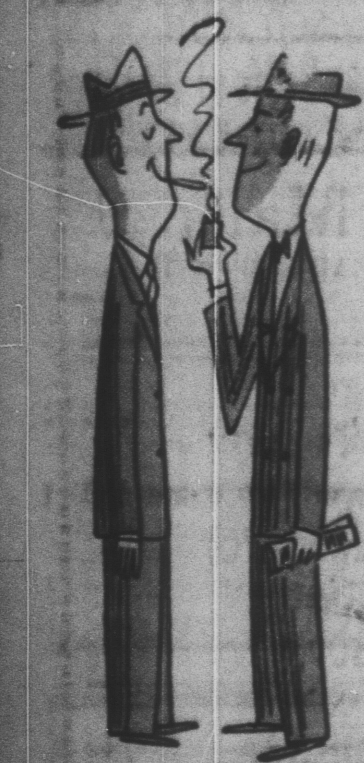
