

Register to Vote Near Your Home Today, Tomorrow, Or Saturday

North Cambria folks who are not registered to vote will have an opportunity to do it close to their homes today, tomorrow or Friday, at sites listed further along in this article.

Those who must register in order to be eligible to cast a ballot in the Presidential election on Nov. 4 include all those who are not registered now, all those who have not cast a ballot during the past two years, and all those who have moved since the last time they voted.

The final day for registering is Saturday, Sept. 13. Field registrars will sit at points throughout the county today, Friday and Saturday, and also at the fairgrounds in Ebensburg, but after that registration point will be at the commissioners' office in the courthouse.

Standard hours will be observed at all field registration sites—from 12 noon until 8 p. m., daylight saving time.

Persons residing anywhere in the county may register at any of the sites—it need not necessarily be the one in the community in which they live.

More Caution By Motorists Urged As Schools Open Up

"School's Open—Drive Carefully" is this week's slogan as thousands of boys and girls have returned to classrooms after the summer vacation. W. C. Mulhollen, chairman of the safety committee of the Johnstown Motor Club, warned motorists this week in a special appeal to use extra caution while driving in school zones.

"Many of the children going to and from school will be in traffic for the first time," Mr. Mulhollen explained, "and it is up to motorists to do everything possible to protect them from traffic hazards. While the School Safety Patrols and police will be on the job at many bad traffic corners, all crossings cannot be protected in this way, and this means that many children will face traffic at unprotected places."

Mr. Mulhollen urged parents to help their children decide on the safest route to school by going with the child along a route which has the least traffic and across the least dangerous corners.

"Motorists should regard every child as a danger signal, and always drive at a speed which will allow them to stop in time to avoid hitting a child who may, unthinkingly, dart out into the street in play. Accident statistics indicate that the play factor is involved in a great proportion of injuries and deaths to school children. No motorist wants to be responsible for a tragedy involving an innocent, playful child who did not think about traffic hazards. It's up to the motorist to think for him, too."

The club is sponsoring its annual AAA "School's Open—Drive Carefully" safety program with the display of special three-color

posters at strategic locations and cars equipped with bumper strips with the same message to remind motorists.
