The time for this Sunday's game was moved up to 1:30 instead of 2:30 p. m. due to the Feast of Christ the King services in St. Benedict's Church at 3:00 o'clock that day.

The final home game for the varsity squad of John Carroll High will be played next Friday, Oct. 31, at 8:00 p. m. in the local stadium against Black Lick Twp. High School. The Mountaineers of Coach Cleoro, who are boasting a fine five win, one defeat season's record will tangle with Southmont High this Saturday afternoon at Southmont. The final game of the season for the Mountaineers will be played on Friday night, Nov. 7, with Barnesboro High at Barnesboro Municipal Stadium.

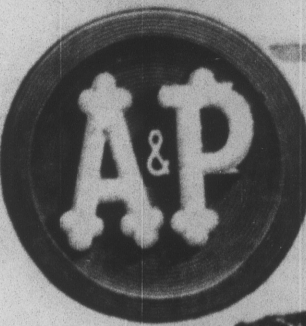
