And according to statistics, the home teams outdid their opponents in both categories. Teams opposing the five local high school grid machines during the 1952 campaign amassed a total of only 8,320 yards gained as against 11,122 for the North Cambrians. The opposing squads scored 522 points against the local gridders.

Barnesboro was the only team to go undefeated, posting nine victories and a 28-28 tie with Class A Ebensburg-Cambria.
