Area Civil Defense Heads Briefed On Next Week's 'Alert'

Leaders of 15 civil defense political subdivisions in Northern Cambria County were briefed on the coming international air alert at a meeting Monday night in the Courthouse at Ebensburg.

General details of the alert and instructions to follow were presented by Max Bloomberg, county defense director. The test is scheduled next Monday and Tuesday.

W. J. Fitzpatrick, assistant to Chairman LaVERN E. Grandy of the communications division, told the group that every subdivision will be notified of the time of alert within the space of two minutes.

He explained that Mr. Bloomberg will receive the initial signal at his home, relay it to the temporary control center at General Telephone Company building, from where relatives will be flashed to each subdivision.

Details of the test were outlined Tuesday night for directors from Southern Cambria County communities.
