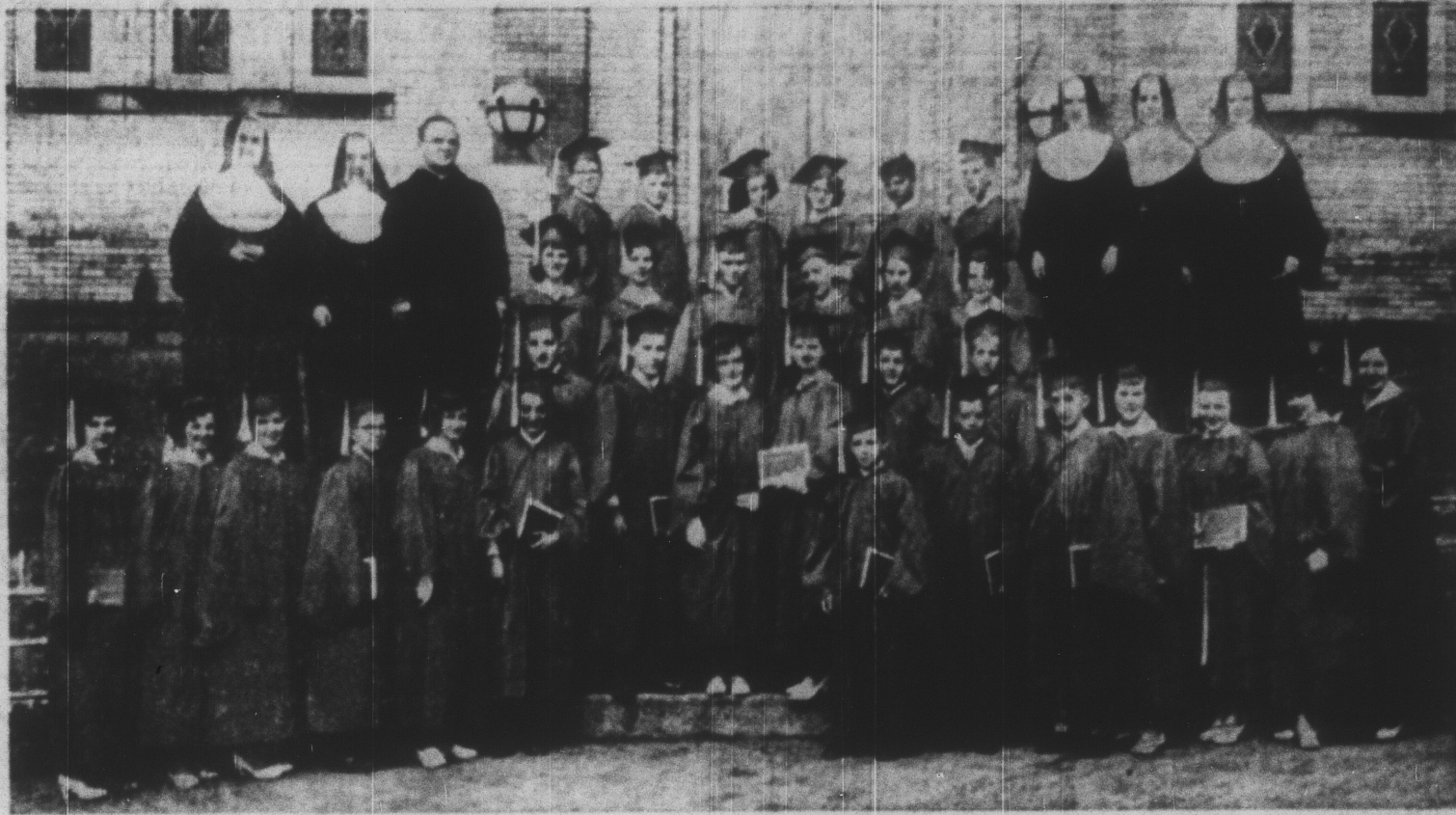

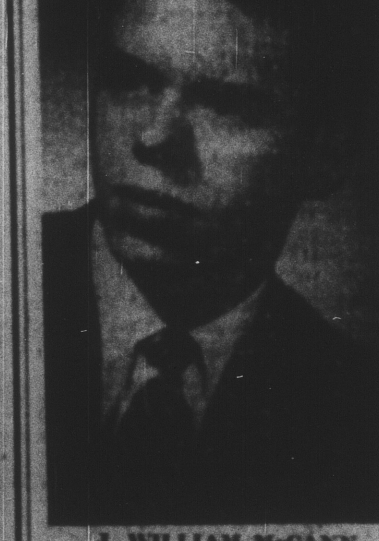
Three Patton natives Monday of this week received degrees at commencement exercises at Penn State University, State College. The three local young people were among 55 from this area to graduate from the school.
