

Emergency Polio Fund Drive Here Set for Aug. 16-31

March of Dimes Has Additional Expenses

An emergency March of Dimes drive has been set for Aug. 16-31 by Cambria County Chapter, National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis.

Leaders of the volunteer campaign organization will be Judge A. A. Nelson of Ebensburg and James E. Harris of Johnstown.

The latter will be the campaign director for Greater Johnstown and Judge Nelson for the remainder of the county. Both are members of the board of directors of the county chapter.

Announcements of the campaign and its directors was made by C. N. Crichton, chapter chairman.

Information received from national headquarters shows that additional funds are needed immediately, he said. The \$55 million raised through the 1954 March of Dimes in January was \$20 million short of the amount needed for the various phases of the program, it was pointed out.

The largest single amount expended in the polio program last year—\$29,734,000—was for care of patients. This item could total \$33.5 million in 1954 if the number of cases remains high, it was said.

To pay for the nationwide polio vaccine trails, in which over a million and a half children participated, and to purchase double the number of doses of gamma globulin used last year for short-term protection, \$26.5 million is reported needed.

The remainder of the necessary polio funds—\$19.8 million—for continued research, professional education and all other costs of

the polio fight, Mr. Crichton noted.

In its last March of Dimes Cambria County Chapter raised \$43,143. The agency already has exhausted its budget allotted for the care of county patients and has spent an additional \$3,000 given by national headquarters.

"The need for funds is desperate," Mr. Crichton said. "The entire polio patient aid program, the prevention program and all the other good works of the National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis are in jeopardy. Lack of funds can close the only door of hope remaining to many thousands of polio victims who depend on the March of Dimes for help."

Gallitzin May Get Swimming Pool

Gallitzin businessmen moved ahead last Thursday night with plans for a community swimming pool by formally organizing the Gallitzin Recreation Board.

The board, with Frank Salvaggio as chairman, will push plans for a proposed \$20,000 to \$25,000 pool. The organization meet was held in the Municipal Building.

Joseph J. Skupien was elected to assist Mr. Salvaggio as co-chairman. Cyril Christy was named secretary and John Varga, treasurer.

Trustees are Sheridan Clossin, Paul Bender, James McClosky, Gerald Angus, Charles Vekakis, A. Ferguson, A. T. Buck, Amadeo Raymond and Donald Bell.

The board announced it has abandoned plans to construct the pool on land adjoining the high school athletic field.

Instead, the board reported it will seek to secure use of the tract of land south of the borough formerly owned by Gallitzin Sportsmen's Association.

This tract recently was transferred to Cambria County commissioners. The commissioners

were to turn it over to the state for designation as a state park. The site would provide ample water for the pool.

Eucharistic Day At Loretto August 22

Anything over that amount will go to the Department of Defense, which has requested about 134 pints a week.
