Coming from behind a 6-0 deficit, the Hawks of Hastings-Elder High School scored in the bobbles, both going to HHS.

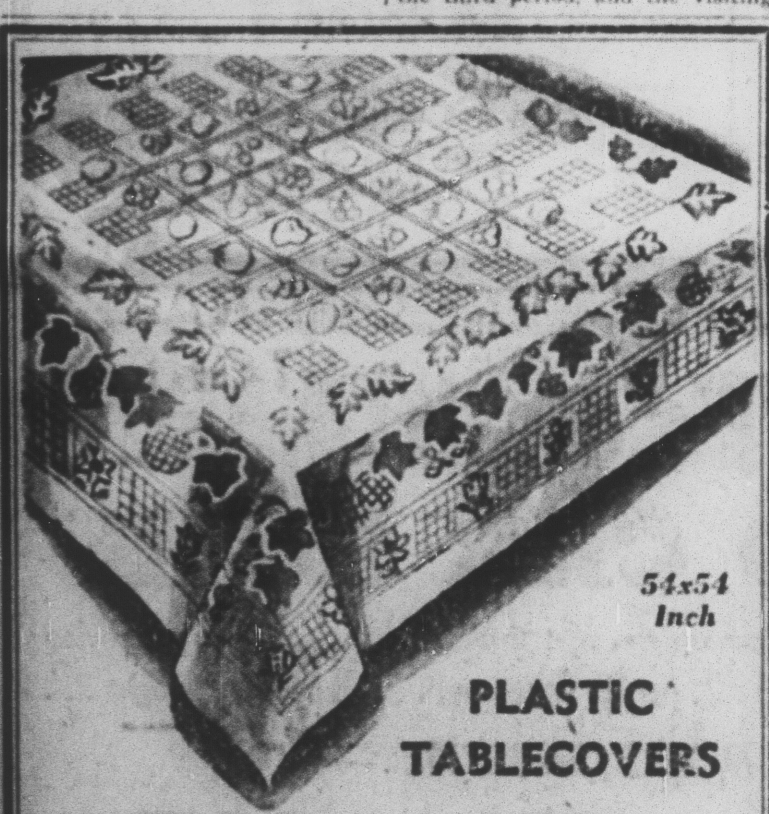
Palmer of Pine Twp. did the honors as he raced off right tackle 30 yards for the score.

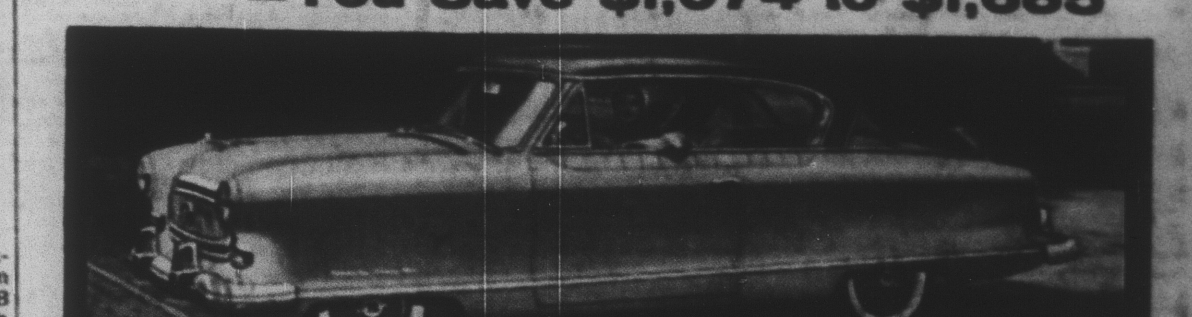
