

Sara Josepha Hale First in a series of card parties will be held in the St. Lawrence Noted As Mother Of Thanksgiving

Thanksgiving dinner this year, i persistent Sarah Josepha Hale spent 17 years nagging Presi-dents, writing letters and printing editorials in the "Godey's Lady's Book" which she edited In the end, she had the satisfaction of seeing President Lan coln sign the first Thanksgiving proclamation since George Wash ington's, Hertha Pauli writes in the November Catholic Digest.

Sarah Hale was a year old when President Washington issued the first Thanksgiving proclamation. She was 75 when Lin coln issued his. In the years since Washington, our annual thank-offering festival has had a varied

history. From 1777 to 1783. . the Continental Congress annually re-solved upon a day of solemn thanksgiving without a dissent-

Once the war was over, however, the first national Congress debated at length whether Washington should set a day to acknowledge "the many and signal favors of Almighty God, especially the peaceable and rational manner in which we have been enabled to establish constitutions of government for our safety and happiness, and particularly the national one now lately institu-ted." There were some strenuous objections to making people give

thanks for a constitution they might not find satisfactory. By 1852 Sarah Hale was able to write "29 states and all terri-tories united in the festival," as tories united in the festival," as a result of her campaigning. But not until 1941, two days after Pearl Harbor, did Tharksgiving become legally an annual national holiday. The casenus squabble over the date of the holiday, touched off by President Franklin D. Roosevelt in 1939, accomplished what Sarah Hale had campaigned for in vain until her 90th year—congressional legislation establishing Thanksgiving for all time.
