Gallitzin Narrowly Wins Over Patton

Using a 10-point lead picked up in the first half, the Gremlins of Gallitzin High School had to really defend that lead to trip the Patton-Chest Twp. High School by a narrow 5-point, 57-52 count last Friday night in a game played at Gallitzin. The loss was the sixth for the Panthers compared to seven victories in current season play.

Still out of action for the visiting Panthers of Head Coach Charles Solomon was Panther Center Jim Schwab, who suffered a laceration of a finger.

The Gremlins of Section A of the North Cambria League, jumped off to a fast 15-8 count in the initial period and then added a 3-point, 15-12 margin in the second chapter to go into the intermission with a 30-20 lead. The host club came back in the third round to gain a close 1-point, 44-43 edge to up their lead to 44-33 at the three-period mark. But the Panthers weren't to be outdone in the final stanza as they showed plenty of life and scored a 19-13 count but not enough to take the victory. The game was the second this season between the two outfits, Gallitzin also winning the first game.
