

Atty. Robert Glass Given Post With Compensation Unit

North Cambrians Also Appointed to Positions

Attorney Robert S. Glass, of Johnstown, has been named a state deputy attorney general assigned to the Workmen's Compensation Board.

The appointment was made by Attorney General Herbert B. Cohen upon recommendation of John R. Torquato. The latter is Cambria County Democratic chairman and is state secretary of labor and industry, to which department Glass has been assigned.

The Johnstown lawyer will handle all compensation appeals in an 18-county area in Western Pennsylvania. The job pays about \$4,500 a year.

Attorney Glass is a Johnstown School Director. Active in Democratic circles, he was his party's nominee for Congress from the 22nd District in 1954. He is a naval veteran of World War II and is solicitor for the Cambria County controller's office.

The Democratic chairman of Indiana County also has been named to a field position in Secretary Torquato's department. He is James E. Trimarchi of Indiana. He will receive \$4,200 annually as an investigator for the Department of Labor and Industry.

Trimarchi has been Indiana County's Democratic chief since 1948. He is engaged in the Christmas tree and nursery business near Indiana.

Many Housewives Have Tax Deadline At End of April

Social Security Levy Due On Domestic Help

Housewives have their own tax deadline to meet this month, Ronald F. McCormick said this week.

Mr. McCormick, Supervisor of Collections for the Johnstown office of the Internal Revenue Service, reminded area housewives that many of them will have to file Special Social Security tax reports by the end of April.

"If you paid at least \$50 in cash to a maid, laundress, or any other domestic worker during the past three months, the law requires you to file a Social Security tax report," Mr. McCormick pointed out that the tax return should be accompanied by the tax payments which amounts to 4 percent of the wages paid to all domestic workers included on the return.

Two percent of the total tax must be paid by the employer. The remaining two percent may be collected from the employee or paid by the housewife, if she desires.

The law regarding domestic workers changed this year. Last year a domestic worker had to work at least 25 days in a quarter in addition to being paid \$50 cash wages to come under the law.

Many more housewives will have to make tax reports for the first time this year because of this change, said Mr. McCormick.

The collections head explained that the tax reports for domestic help should be made on the special household report, Form 942, which can be secured from the local Internal Revenue office. Richard C. Westling, manager

of the Johnstown Social Security office meanwhile urged all domestic workers who have not as yet obtained Social Security cards to do so promptly.

"When your employer files a tax report, she must show your name, your Social Security number, and the amount of wages paid to you during the period covered by the report."

Mr. Westling stressed the importance of making sure that the employer shows the correct Social Security number so that the

worker will receive credit for her earnings.

Domestic workers are building up credit through their earnings so that retirement benefits will be paid to them at age 65. These same credits may permit the payment of benefits to their dependents in case of death before 65.

Social Security Facts for Farm Families

Income That a Farmer Must Exclude for S. S. Purposes

Rental income must be excluded in figuring the net profit for Social Security. It doesn't make any difference how rental income is paid, whether in cash, merchandise or crop shares. If you receive income as rent for the

use of farm land, do not include it in your net profit.

Other income which is received from transactions not connected with the operation of the farm also must be excluded. For example, stock dividends and bank interest do not count for Social Security. Remember that these exclusions are for Social Security only. The rules for income tax are different.
