### Democratic Victory In 1956 Predicted At Annual Dinner

#### 600 Attend Jefferson-Jackson Event Saturday

A Democratic victory in the 1956 presidential election was predicted by State Secretary of Labor and Industry John R. Torquato at a Jefferson-Jackson Day dinner last Saturday evening in Oriental Ballroom, Gallitzin.

"In 1956," Mr. Torquato said, "the people of America will say they have had enough of the Eisenhower change and vote in a Democratic administration in Washington."

More than 600 persons heard the state official predict that within the next two years there will be "a completely Democratic government in Harrisburg."

Mr. Torquato emphasized, however, that it will require the complete cooperation of every Democratic organization in the state and nation to bring about a change in the administration.

Confining his talk entirely to politics, the state official praised work of young Democrats in Cambria County and the state in general in bringing about the election of Gov. George M. Leader.

The affair was sponsored by the Young Democrats of Cambria Co. He also traced the advancement of the Democratic Party in Cambria County during the last 25 years.

"We are looking, said Mr. Torquato, who also is Cambria Co. Democratic chairman "to young people to carry out the work of continuing to strengthen the party both in Cambria County and in the state."

He urged the young Democrats to coordinate their activities with the county committee—the policy-making group of the party.

Brief remarks also were made by the area candidates for county offices. All called for complete unity in the party during the coming primary and general elections.

Attorney William D. Shettig of Ebensburg served as toastmaster. Rev. Father Eugene Bradley, the pastor of St. Patrick's Church, Gallitzin, gave the invocation.

### Barnesboro Fire Volunteers Plan Home Solicitation

A house-to-house drive for funds to help defray expenses of a new \$100,000 fire hall in the Barnesboro community got under way Monday of this week.

Richard H. Steele Sr., chairman of Hope Volunteer Fire Company's ways and means committee, said the campaign will be conducted this week and all of next week.

Company trucks began Monday night to carry volunteers throughout the area serviced by Barnesboro unit. Donation envelopes will be distributed this week and collected next week.

Solicitation of business firms in the area already has netted approximately \$1,500, Mr. Steele said.

Raising of the old Malta Building on Philadelphia Ave., is nearing completion and construction of the new fire hall is expected to start within the next two or three weeks.

A shipment of steel and cement blocks already has arrived at the construction site. Gerald Kirach of Nicktown, who holds the general contract, said construction will begin as soon as the building site is cleared.

The annual meeting of Cambria County Historical Society will be held at 7:30 p. m. Friday in Courtroom No. 3 of the Ebensburg courthouse. Election of officers will follow reports on activities the past year.
