

### County Democrats Hold Rally Friday Night At Ebensburg

#### Committeemen Urged To Support 'Slate'

Democratic committeemen and women were urged to react vigorously to charges by unslated candidates of "dictatorship" at a meeting of several hundred party workers in the Ebensburg Courthouse last Friday night.

Party leaders, from County Chairman John R. Torquato down, urged the committee personnel to support the slated candidates and recruit as many votes as possible at the May 17 primary election Tuesday of next week.

Besides the county chairman, speakers included Judge A. A. Nelson, Attorneys Alton A. McDonald and Arnold D. Smorot, Commissioner Thomas A. Owens, Michael C. Chervenak, Sheriff John A. Conway and Judge Ivan J. McKenrick. All are candidates for office except Chairman Torquato and Judge McKenrick.

Other county and Johnstown City Democratic candidates of the

organization were introduced and took a bow.

Attorney McDonald stressed the importance to the party of having a majority on the common pleas court bench. He said that for 24 years Cambria County had two Democrats on the bench until the death last year of Judge John H. McCann. He said that former Gov. Fine had appointed a Republican to a judgeship "that rightfully belonged to a Democrat," because the late Judge McCann was elected as a Democrat. This, he said, gave the Republicans a judicial majority in "a Democratic county."

Sheriff Conway, a candidate for the Democratic nomination for Mayor of the City of Johnstown, spoke on his behalf for election to that post.

Chairman Torquato defended the policy of slating candidates for public office and said the candidates were selected by the organization and not by the chairman. "You should resent the charge that candidates are being pushed down your throat," he said.

Party workers were given their poll watchers' certificates, sample ballots and street addresses of registered Democrats in their respective districts.

### Duquesne U. Tamburitzans At Loretto Next Wednesday

Duquesne University's famed Tamburitzans, the only organization of its kind in the United States, will appear in Doyle Hall on the campus of St. Francis College, Loretto, next Wednesday, May 18, at 8:15 p. m. (DST).

The costumes, dances and instrumentation used in the two-hour program are outstanding and of unique origin. The growing popularity of the Tamburitzans have afforded their appearances in the United States, Canada and Europe. Their excellent programming, colorful entertainment, and superb showmanship are qualities which have become traditions

with these artists and have earned them the name, "America's most colorful musical organization."

They are directed by Walter W. Kolar who first came to the Tamburitzans in 1938 during which time he attended Duquesne's Prep School. This season he presents his 20 singers, players and dancers, whose talent equals those of professional artists, on the Loretto, Pa., campus. His arrangements and interpretations of Slavic music have been greatly

appreciated by young and old alike.

The Tamburitzans get their name from a musical instrument called the tamburizza, which is one of the oldest instruments known to man, a forerunner of the mandolin, guitar and balalaika. It is the instrument used by the internationally famous Tamburitzans of Duquesne University.

The Tamburitzans play and sing and dance their way through college. They are versatile performers who have two missions to

fulfill: 1. While a student to gain a degree from the University and 2. To perpetuate Southern Slavic music and dance.

Rev. Fr. Charles Ginochio, TOR, chairman of the program committee, stated that this will be one of the finest programs to be presented on the St. Francis College campus. He invites the public to attend and arrangements will be made for special seating for the public. The admission will be \$1.50 for the two-hour program.
