Hoxsey Hearing In Federal Court Again Postponed

Action Delayed After Constitution Cited

The proposed investigation by U. S. Attorney John W. McIlvaine of Pittsburgh of the Hoxsey Cancer Clinic at Portage was delayed again Tuesday of this week as the defense pleaded that their constitutional rights would be violated under the fifth amendment. Counsel for the clinic, Attorneys Benedict F. Fitzgerald Jr. and Arnold D. Smorto, said that if their clients are required to answer they will thereby be compelled to testify against themselves in violation of the privileges granted to them by the Fifth Amendment to the Constitution of the United States. This same holds true for any documents the clinic staff would be called upon to produce, the lawyers said. The unexpected action came in a motion filed in U. S. District Court, Federal Judge John L.
