#### **6 Million Couples Married 25 Years**

Almost 41/2 Million Women Wedded Twice

The Census Bureau at Washing ton reported the other day it has counted at least 5,800,000 American marriages that have lasted 25 years or more. The statistics came out of a survey of married women, made when the last census was taken in 1950. The bureau also found The average length of marriage

married only once was about 13½ years.
There were some 4,400,000 wo men who had been married two or more times and were living with their current husbands. For these wonem their current mar-riage had lasted an average of

about 814 years at the time the census was taken. There were some 1,155,000 divorced women counted. Of these 226,000 had been married more than once. Another million wo men were separated from their husbands, and about 214,00 of these had been married more than

On the average, divorced wom-en who had not married again reported they has been single about four and a half years, and women separated from their husbands reported separations averaging just over four years.

The study covered women 15 to 59 years old.


