AAA Warns Speed Enforcement Drive Underway in Area

Most intensive drive on record to force compliance with posted speed limits is under way since the start of the 1955 vacation season. The Johnstown Motor Club was advised by AAA National Headquarters today.
"Major weapon in this stepped-up war against speed violation is the so-called 'radar' detection device," Cyrus W. Davis, president of the Johnstown Club said. "Close to a thousand of these devices are being operated along the nation's highways—some for speed-checks but the great majority for enforcement."
Rapid growth in use of radar sets by police and highway departments was shown by these figures from FCC:
Radar sets in use in the Spring of 1954 totaled 368; by December of last year, this figure had risen to 834; now 989 are licensed. This is an increase of 74.3 percent over the number of sets in use at this time last year. These are in addition to an unknown number of other speed-detection devices which do not require Federal licenses.
"Now as never before," Johnstown Motor Club warned, "it's important to keep a light foot on the accelerator and observe all the posted speed limits."


Funds for Dam At Dysart Refused By County Parks Unit


