## Area Saddened By Death of Coach George Magulick, 36

### North Cambria High Mentor III Since May

George (Skinny) Magulick, 36, a resident of North Spangler, one of the most popular and best-known athletes and coaches in this section of Pennsylvania, died at 6:30 a. m. last Friday, July 8, at Miners Hospital, Spangler. He had been a medical patient in the hospital since Saturday, July 2, but had been ill since early last May.

Mr. Magulick became ill with a virus infection while attending a football clinic at Michigan State College in May. Magulick's death came as a shock to most every resident in Cambria County. Passing in the prime of life, Mr. Magulick was very well known.

The well-known area coach this year would have observed his 13th year as a coach in the high school football circles. For 11 seasons he successfully directed the prominent Barnesboro High School gridiron machines, last year taking over as head gridiron and athletic director of the new Northern Cambria High School. He began his coaching career in Barnesboro in 1943.

Passing at only 36 years of age, Mr. Magulick in his short time compiled an athletic record that served as an inspiration to many a young athlete.

"Skinny," as he was known to his wide acquaintance, was a graduate of Spangler High School where he broke a number of records in sports activities. While a student at Spangler he broke the Cambria County and District 8 P.F.A. record in the broad jump. He will be remembered as the high scorer in the Northern Cambria Football Conference in 1952 and he held one of the records for the longest run in scholastic football history. In 1951 he ran 103 yards for a touchdown in a game against Franklin.

Mr. Magulick was a four-year man in football at Spangler High. In his freshman year he played end; half back in his sophomore year, and quarterback in his junior and senior years. He was also a three-year letterman in track and in basketball while in high school.

The well-known coach won a scholarship at the University of Pittsburgh in track. In his sophomore year at Pitt, however,

he transferred to St. Francis College in Loretto, when athletics were de-emphasized at the University of Pittsburgh. At St. Francis "Skinny" played three years as one of the school's best half backs. Always a threat as a player in high school, the Spangler man was considered one of the most outstanding football players in the history of St. Francis College football.

He served as a lieutenant in U. S. Marine Corps during World War II, and also played a season with the Professional Pittsburgh Steelers football team.

As head football coach for 11 consecutive seasons at Barnesboro High School, and last season for the North Cambria Joint High School, Mr. Magulick's teams were always considered as outstanding. Magulick-coached teams were always considered by every opponent as a "threat." In 10 seasons at Barnesboro his grid teams produced a fine 54-win, 32-loss, 3-tie record. In 1949 his Barnesboro High team won the Northern Cambria County Conference championship. In 1952 Magulick's Barnesboro team emerged as the first undefeated team in the school's history. The Magulick-coached Barnesboro outfits of 1951 and 1952 won the Union Press-Courier Football Trophy League of Northern Cambria County, receiving possession of the award in 1952. In 1952 Mr. Magulick was also named as the "Coach of the Year" in this district, being voted the coveted honor by Johnstown sportswriters and sportscasters. His 1952 team was also the highest scoring team in this district.

Last season Mr. Magulick embarked with the first football team of the Northern Cambria Joint High School and this first season playing Class A ball for the first time against a very heavy schedule, broke even with five wins and five defeats.

While coaching at Barnesboro, Mr. Magulick headed the school's baseball teams in 1947 and 1948, and both these teams won championships. For a number of years he also served as head basketball mentor at Barnesboro. In basketball he brought the team into prominence. In the district conference in 1945, Magulick's team won first place and defeated that season only by Johnstown High School.

The well-known coach held a teaching major in social studies and English, and also taught physical education. He earned credits in physical education at Pennsylvania State University.

The Spangler resident was very prominent in independent and sporting activities for youth. This year he took over as head of the Midlet League Baseball program in Barnesboro. He also was interested a few years back in the area independent baseball leagues and the North Cambria Pony Baseball League. Mr. Magulick also served as a member of the Adult Troop Committee of Boy Scout Troop 271, Barnesboro.

He was an active member in all of the athletic and coaching organizations of which his school was a member. He was a member of Barnesboro Lions Club, Barnesboro American Legion Post, Barnesboro Polish American Legion Club and the Holy Name Society of St. Stanislaus' Catholic Church, Barnesboro.

George Magulick is survived by

his widow, the former Miss Steffi Rock, and two young sons, George Jr. and Richard, both at home. He is also survived by his mother, Mrs. Mary Ashcroft Magulick.

He was a brother of Steve Magulick, Mrs. Margaret Radevian and Edward Magulick, all of Spangler; Daniel Magulick of Youngtown, Ohio and Mrs. Martha Montello of Marsteller.
