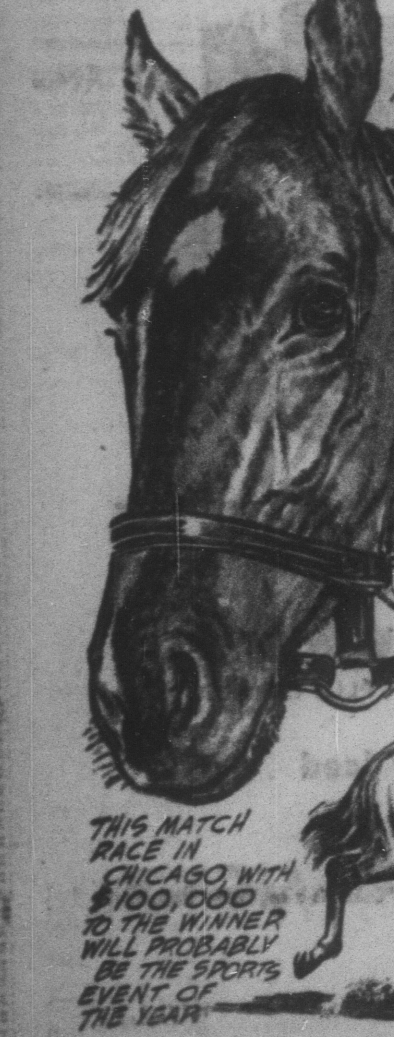
Barnesboro to Be Host Again For Little League Tourney

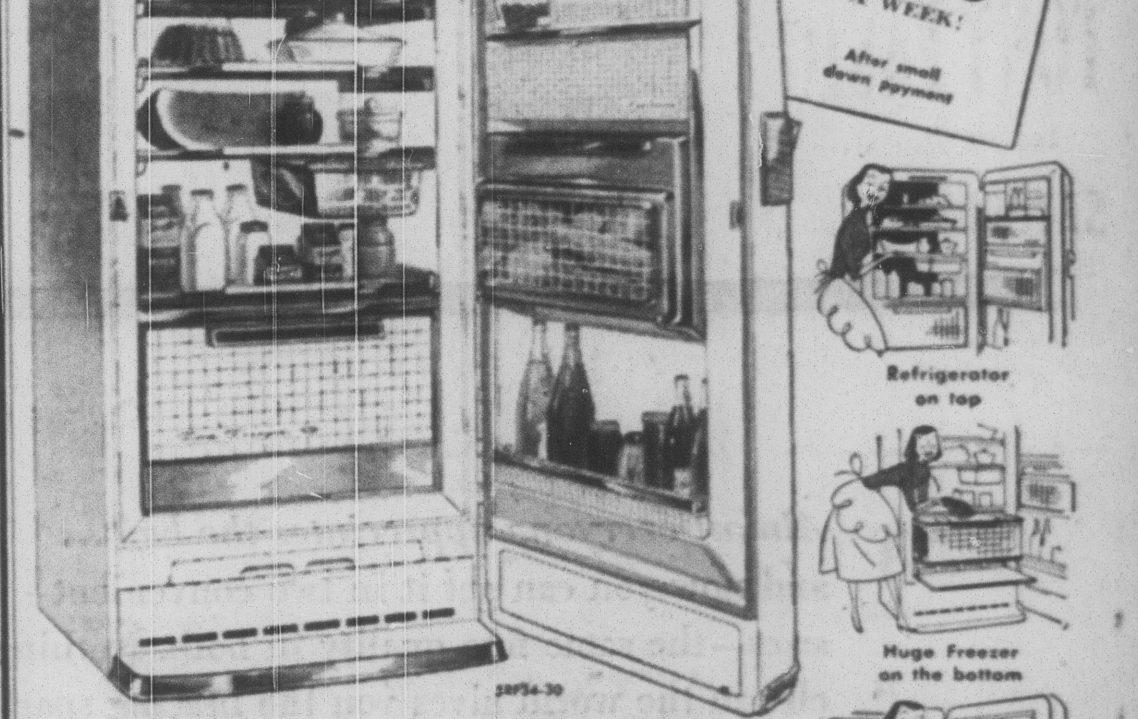
