Charles Brancato of Barnesboro has been elected president of the North Cambria Joint School Committee. At the same time directors hiked the salary of Miss Kathleen Dumm, school clerk in Spangler Joint, from \$900 to \$1,500 on a 12-month basis. School Board, meeting prior to the committee session, announced plans to advertise for bids for two new 60 to 73-passenger school buses.
