Ebensburg Woman Picked Up On Street

A Johnstown man has been jailed on three counts, including two serious morals charges, for an assault on a 50-year-old Ebensburg woman.

He is William F. (Bill) Platt, 32, of 417 Russell Avenue, a salesman, who pleaded not guilty to assault with intent to ravish, aggravated assault and battery and sodomy. A preliminary hearing was held before Mrs. Elizabeth Rowland, Ebensburg justice of the peace.

Platt was arrested by Ebensburg Police Chief Theodore Jervis and State Police from the Ebensburg substation.

The Ebensburg woman told police she was walking home about 1 a. m. on a Saturday when a man she thought she knew drove up in a car, called her by name and offered her a ride.

Instead of driving to her home, the motorist drove down a side street and attacked her, police were informed.

The victim told authorities that she was kept in the auto until nearly 5 a. m. At one point when she attempted to escape, police said, the assailant grabbed her, tearing out handfuls of hair. The woman also suffered multiple bruises of the arms, legs and body.
