New York, Oct. 9.—The following dispatch has been received from St. Kitts, under date of Oct. 1:

A terrible disaster occurred in the harbor of Barreterre within a stone's throw of the shore, by which thirteen persons were drowned in the height of the storm of Sept. 20. One of the traders between St. Kitts and Nevis, in which were twenty-two passengers and crew, foundered.

AGRICULTURE IN OTHER LANDS.

A SCHOOL of practical agriculture has been established in the province of Buenos Ayres, under direction of the Argentine government. This is the first institution of the kind in that country, and great hopes are entertained of its elevating influence on agriculture in Argentina.

Dimed peat or turf, cut from bogs, is largely used for fuel throughout Europe. Some of it is molded much as bricks are, and it is also pressed into the compact balls.
