

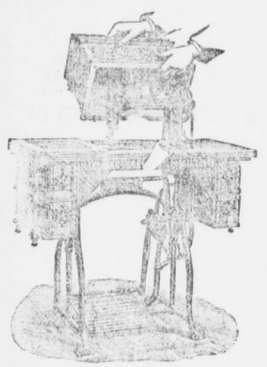

### Crime Caused by Love.

There certainly must be something in the peculiar sensation that we call love that is specially demoralizing to some dispositions and temperaments. For surely the vagaries committed in the name of love are legion.
