SOCIETIES AND LODGES.

Conventions Held by a Number of Organizations Last Week. The national convention of the Catholic Total Abstinence Union of America was held at Scranton.

Rev. James M. Clearly, of Minneapolis, Minn., the president, said the Catholic Church was against the saloon and condemned liquor selling on Sunday.

Resolutions were adopted reiterating former declarations with reference to Catholics engaged in the liquor business; declaring for a memorial day for deceased members; urging the formation of boys', girls' and women's societies; deploring the illicit traffic in liquor; and urging steps for its early and complete suppression.

The silk prize banner for the society showing the largest increase in membership was awarded to St. Leo's Society, of Scranton, whose gain was 222.

Before the convention finally closed, James Jennings, 83 years old, and the father of Hugh Jennings, the famous short stop, was introduced, and from the platform displayed the medal given him over 50 years ago by Father Mathew.

The state convention of the Knights of Pythias was held at Scranton. It was voted to increase the per capita tax to 24 cents for each two years.

Nominations for the 1898 election were made as follows: Grand chancellor, John S. Graham, Lancaster; vice grand chancellor, Scott Dilbert, Pittsburg; grand prelate, Thomas T. Thompson, Philadelphia; grand master-at-arms, Charles D. Ernst, Punksutawney; grand trustee, John W. Beebe, Philadelphia; grand keeper of the records and seal, George Hawkes, John Stratton and Smith D. Cozzens, Philadelphia, and D. J. Neal, Lancaster.

The Irish Catholic Benevolent Union met at Scranton. Rev. Thomas Irechony, delivered a stirring address to the delegates at the opening of the convention.

Officers were elected as follows: President, Daniel Duffy, St. Clair, Pa.; vice presidents, John J. Behan, Kingston, Ont., and Miss Kate Gorman, of Providence, R. I.; treasurer, Thos. J. Foley, Gloucester, N. J.; secretary, Augustus A. Boyle, Philadelphia; executive committee, C. C. Driscoll, Tennessee; M. F. Kane, Shamokin, Pa., and J. F. Fogarty, Providence, R. I.

The Legion of Honor held its national convention at Buffalo. Amendments were adopted fixing a rate of assessment for all members and abolishing classes, restricting the assessment to one in any one month, and providing that, if this is not sufficient, claims to be paid at the end of the year shall be paid from the reserve fund.
