COPY OF THE WARRANT.

The following is a copy of the warrant issued.

To the coroner, Frank L. McKee, in said county, greeting. Whereas, information hath this day been made before us, the Honorable John Lynch and Honorable L. H. Bennett, judges of the court of oyer and terminer and general jail delivery and ex-officio justices of the peace, in and for said county of Luzerne, upon the oath of Isaac G. Eckert, of Wilkesbarre, that James Martin, et al. (names of deputies), did on the tenth day of September inst., at the said village of Lattimer, in the county of Luzerne, state of Pennsylvania, and within jurisdiction of this court, feloniously, willfully and of their malice aforethought, kill and murder Clemens Platch, (here follows names of twenty-four victims), contrary to the form of the act of general assembly in such cases made and provided, and against the peace and dignity of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

These are therefore to command you, Frank L. McKee, coroner of Luzerne county, forthwith to take the said James Martin, et al., and bring them before us, said Honorable John Lynch and L. H. Bennett, judges of the court of oyer and terminer and the general jail delivery and ex-officio justices of the peace, to answer the said charge, and further to be dealt with according to law.

NEWS OF THE WEEK.

Wednesday, Sept. 15. The Brooklyn Republican county committee passed resolutions by an overwhelming vote favoring the nomination of Seth Low for mayor of Greater New York.

Monday, Sept. 20. President McKinley, after a long consultation with Consul General Fitzhugh Lee, asked that official to retain his office and return to Havana, which he consented to do.

Thursday, Sept. 16. The New York Democratic state central committee expelled Henry D. Purroy, a committeeman from New York City, on the charge of disloyalty to the party.

Friday, Sept. 17. An attempt was made to stab President Diaz of Mexico by a man believed to be an anarchist; the would-be assassin was arrested before he did any harm to the president.

Tuesday, Sept. 21. According to the Paris Temps, Minister Woodford informed the Duke of Tetuan, at Madrid, that the war in Cuba must come by the end of October, or this country would intervene.

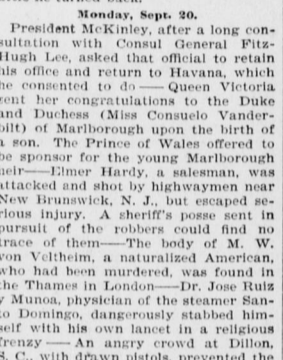
Saturday, Sept. 18. New York state Republican committee met in New York City and nominated Judge William J. Wallace of Albany for chief justice of the court of appeals.
