Their present and last stand is in the Indian Territory, where their neighbors, the Cherokees, are seeking to compel them to put their tribal lands, which they bought and paid for, into a common pool, and the case is now pending in the United States Court of Claims.
They have finally lost faith in the white man and propose to take up their abode in Mexico, where the Indian enjoys all the rights and privileges accorded to other inhabitants and where a land tille in the name of a ruling doe.






