NEW LINE ABANDONED.

PROPOSED INDEPENDENT COAL ROAD WILL NOT BE BUILT.

Individual Operators Who Were Back of the Project Taken in Hand by a Morgan Combination—Plan of the Grasping Trust to Throttle Competition.

The following interesting statement regarding the abandonment of the independent anthracite coal operators' proposed line from Scranton to Tidewater, for a portion of which the rails have already been ordered, is from the New York Evening Post of Tuesday:

Shenandoah's Destructive Fire.

The largest fire in Shenandoah for ten years occurred on Tuesday morning, and for a while the entire business portion of the town was endangered.

The buildings destroyed were those of A. H. Swalm, hardware establishment; J. Portz & Bros., merchant tailors; Kalbach, a tobacco and cigar manufacturer; the other, Jacob Noll, conducted a restaurant on one side, while the other was occupied by John Creary, a tailor, and Jacob Lessig's large millinery store.
