Official investigation of the Cranberry grade crossing accident, in which three young women were killed by a Pennsylvania Railroad passenger train on Wednesday last week, was begun on Tuesday by Deputy Coroner Dr. J. H. Bowman. Twenty witnesses have been heard thus far. Considerable interest is being manifested in the inquest. The jury is now considering the testimony.
