Two performing bears attracted a great deal of attention on Centre street today. One of them is apparently a confirmed toper and drank whisky and beer as fast as it was furnished to him.

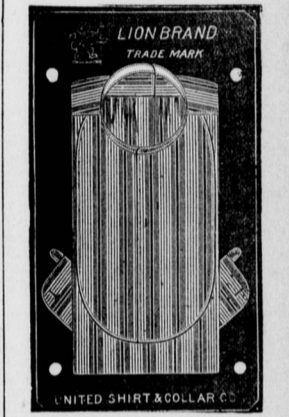
