Miss Mildred Jones, of Bloomsburg College spent the week-end with her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Hugh Jones.

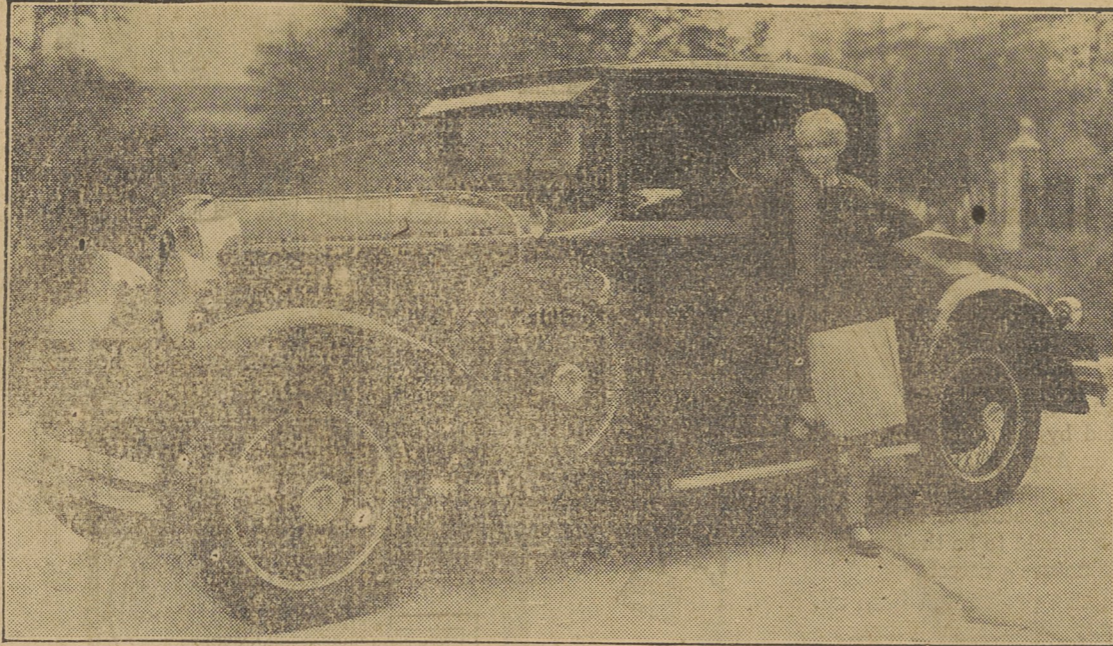

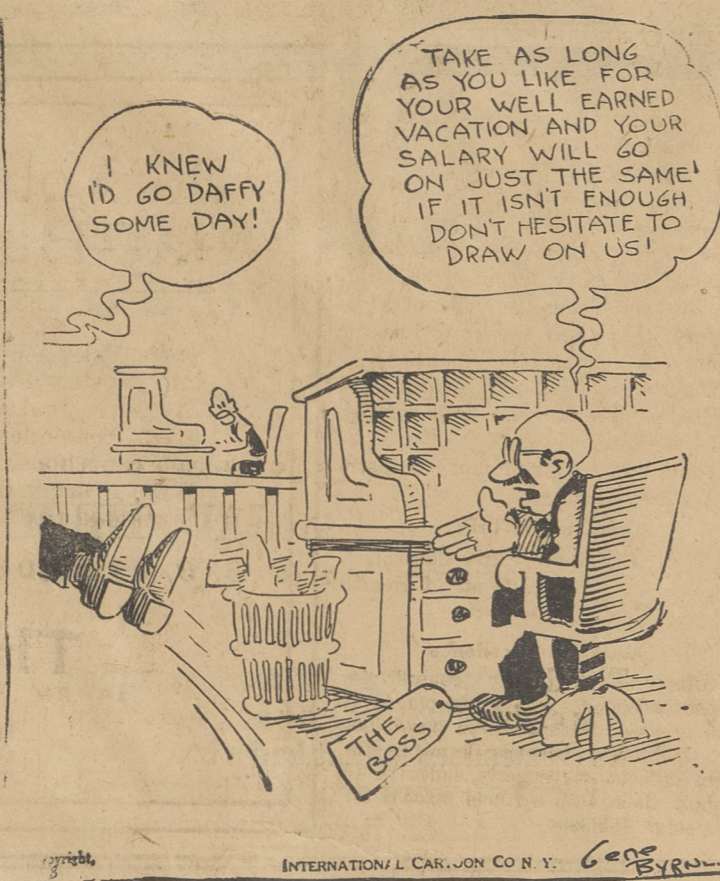
