BEST DEER SEASON

Without any question, the finest buck season in the history of the State came to a close December 14. Large kills were reported from almost every section and it is estimated that between 13,000 and 15,000 legal deer were taken during the first week of the season. Generally speaking, the creatures killed this year were larger and had bigger antlers than for many years past. Less violations occurred. Since the beginning of the deer season eight hunters were killed and thirteen wounded. Last year five hunters were killed and twenty-five wounded within the period of fifteen days. Perhaps one of the reasons responsible for so few violations can be attributed to some of the unique slogans adopted by a great many camps. Here is one which should have had good effect: "Look for His Horns! If you don't see any, she has none."

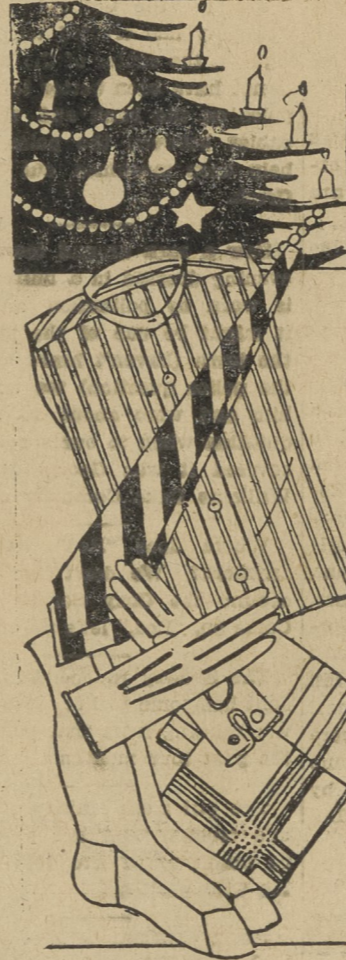

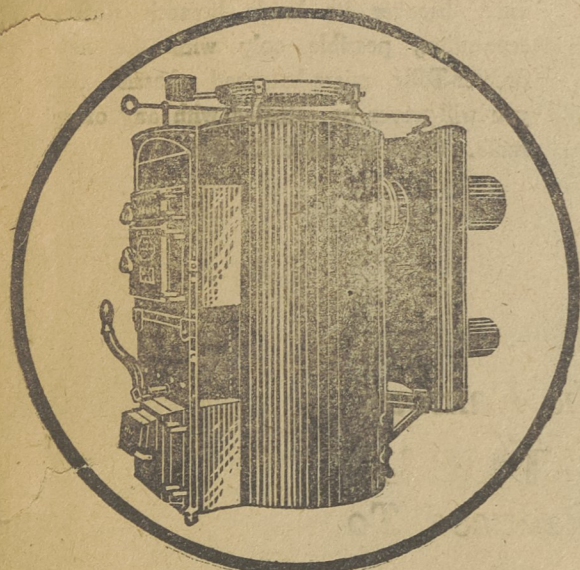
