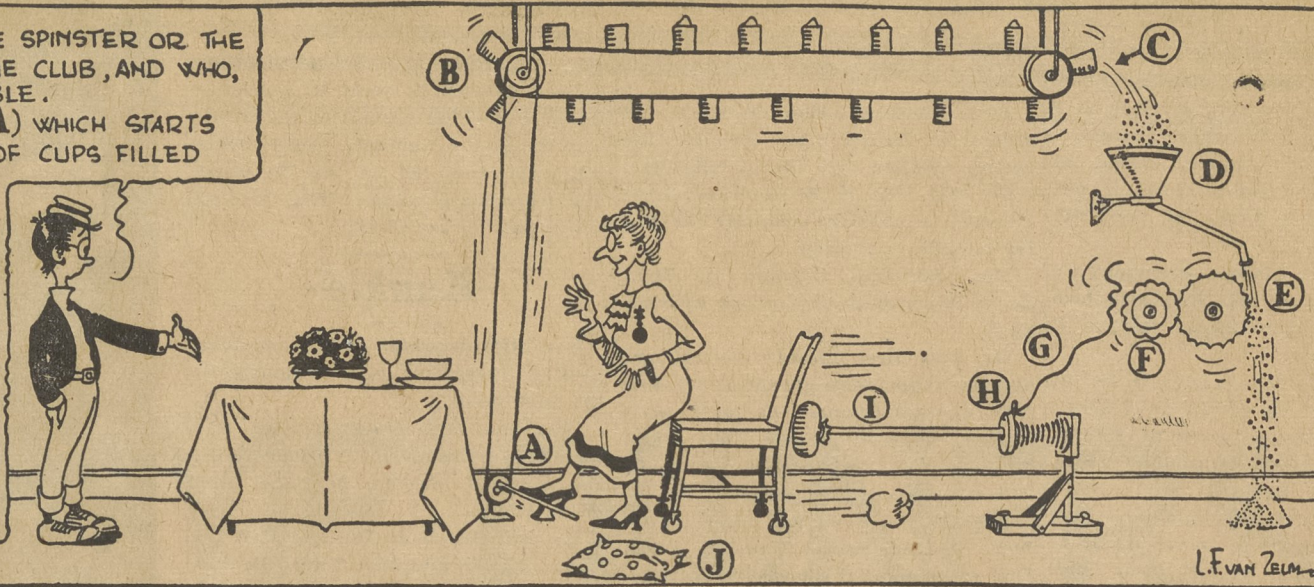

STRING (G) THEN UNWINDS FROM WHEEL (F), RELEASES SPRING (H), WHICH SHOOTS OUT ARM (I), WHICH PUSHES CHAIR QUICKLY UP TO LADY. WHEN CHAIR HITS LADY IN BACK OF KNEES, IT IS TIME TO SIT DOWN. IN CASE THIS INVENTION SHOULD NOT WORK SMOOTHLY WE ADVISE HAVING PILLOW (J) HANDY.

ADRIAN JONES WILL RUN FOR STATE SENATE

Hazleton Lawyer Throws Hat In Ring For Office Now Held By A. J. Sordoni

This is the first of a series of articles on the lives and qualifications of aspirants for public office whose names will be voted upon the coming primary election. These articles will be written in an impartial, unbiased manner and their appearance here does not mean that they have the support of the Post. They are written simply for the enlightenment of the electorate.—Editor.

Adrian H. Jones of West Hazleton, prominent and successful member of the Luzerne County bar, who filed nomination papers for State Senator, enters the political arena with a background of public service and experience, which fits him for a campaign of progressive and intelligent issues and equips him for the high office to which he is aspiring.

Born and raised in the Twentieth Senatorial District, Jones has always been Republican, a regular of the regulars. For the last score of years he has been an active practitioner in the local courts, Superior and Supreme Courts of Pennsylvania as well as the District and Appellate Courts of the United States. He is now forty-four years of age, married and has a family.

Educated at the East Stroudsburg Normal school, Lehigh University, Dickinson Law School, Attorney Jones ranks as one of the most learned in the county. He has always been active in public school affairs in his town and in Pennsylvania. He has served two terms as school direc-

tor, one term as secretary of the Pennsylvania School Directors' Association and has been solicitor for several school boards for a number of years.

The borough of West Hazleton and the school district of that town has retained him as attorney for twenty years, while the borough of Conyngham, township of Black Creek, has retained him for a number of years. Mr. Jones is also attorney for the Hazleton Motor Club, which organization he has served in this capacity for over sixteen years, during which time he has led many important movements for improved highways.

During the Liberty Loan drives, Attorney Jones was in the forefanks of the four-minute speakers.

In the business world, Mr. Jones has experience, now being a director of the Miners Bank, West Hazleton Building and Loan Association, Hazleton Floral Company and the Hazleton Thrift and Loan Association. For many years he was engaged in home developments. Fraternally he is a member of several lodges and civic organizations.
