

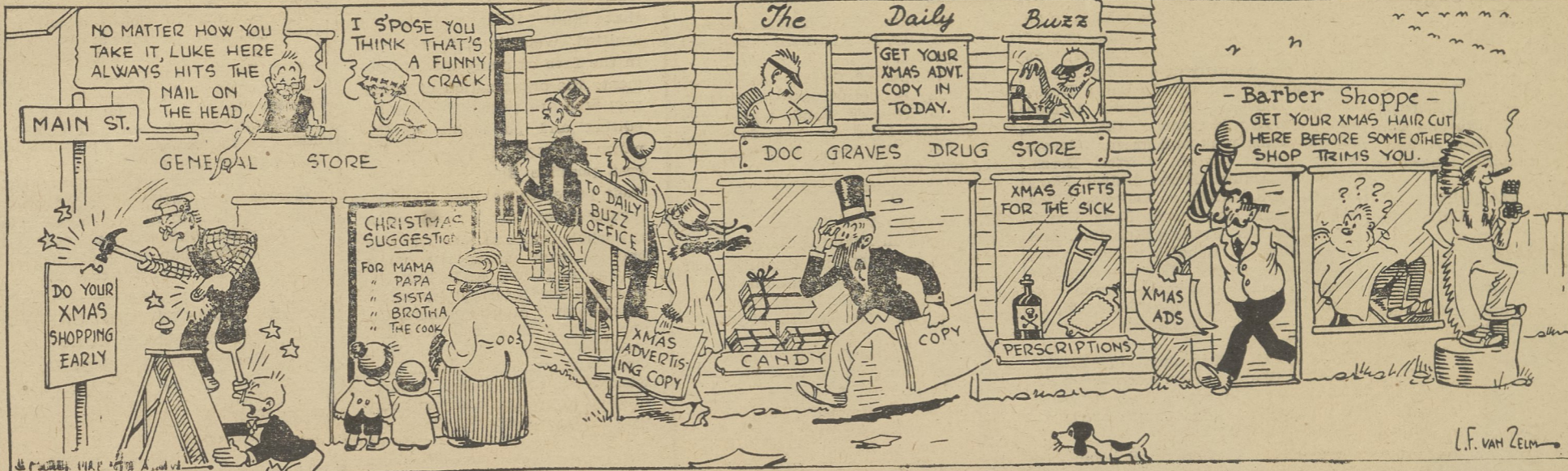

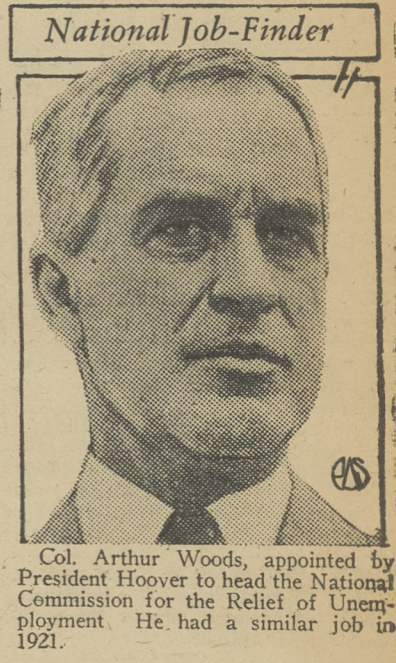

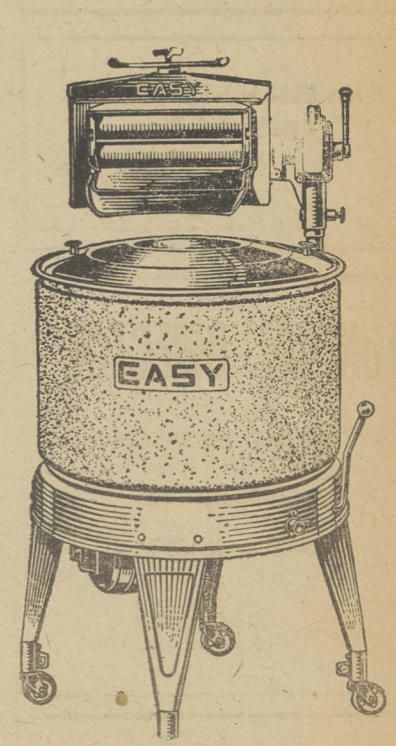

NOTICE
Water Consumers

Allowances for vacancy" on water bills will hereafter be made only when the consumer properly notifies the water company of the vacancy and receives a "vacancy receipt" from the company according to rule 5 of its general rules and regulations.

RULE 5

Fifth. No abatement of, nor reduction from, bill for water rent will be allowed by reason of a diminished use, disuse or vacancy of premises, unless notice thereof shall have been given at the main office of the Company when the vacancy occurs, and the payment shall have been made for shutting off the supply; and the Company may make restrictions in the use of water whenever, in their opinion, the public exigencies require it. Also notice must be given when houses, baths, closets, etc., are re-occupied and in use. A receipt will be given of all vacancies.
