#### Son of Steel Magnate Becomes Famous Orchestra Leader

New York City.—"Music is as much a Big Business as steel." This is the opinion of Don Bigelow, blue stocking orchestra leader of Manhattan. "Music is as practical as any so-called big business," Bigelow declares. "My father has an office at his steel plant ready for me, but I like music better and I'm making more money than any steel plant could pay a man who had been on the job only one year. "A few years ago, musicians were a kind of family curse. To have one around the home was about like having a queer old maid aunt. One didn't talk about it. "But now all that is changed. The musician is respectable and respected for he must know his

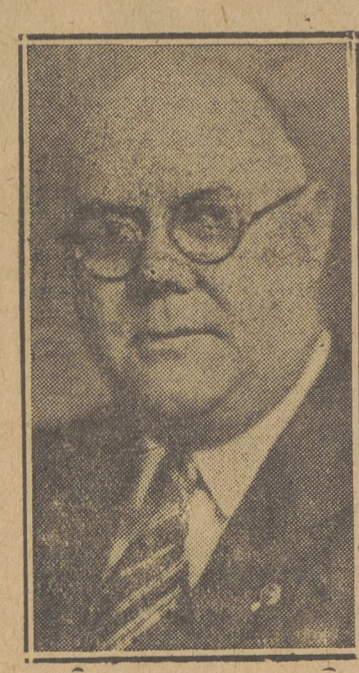
