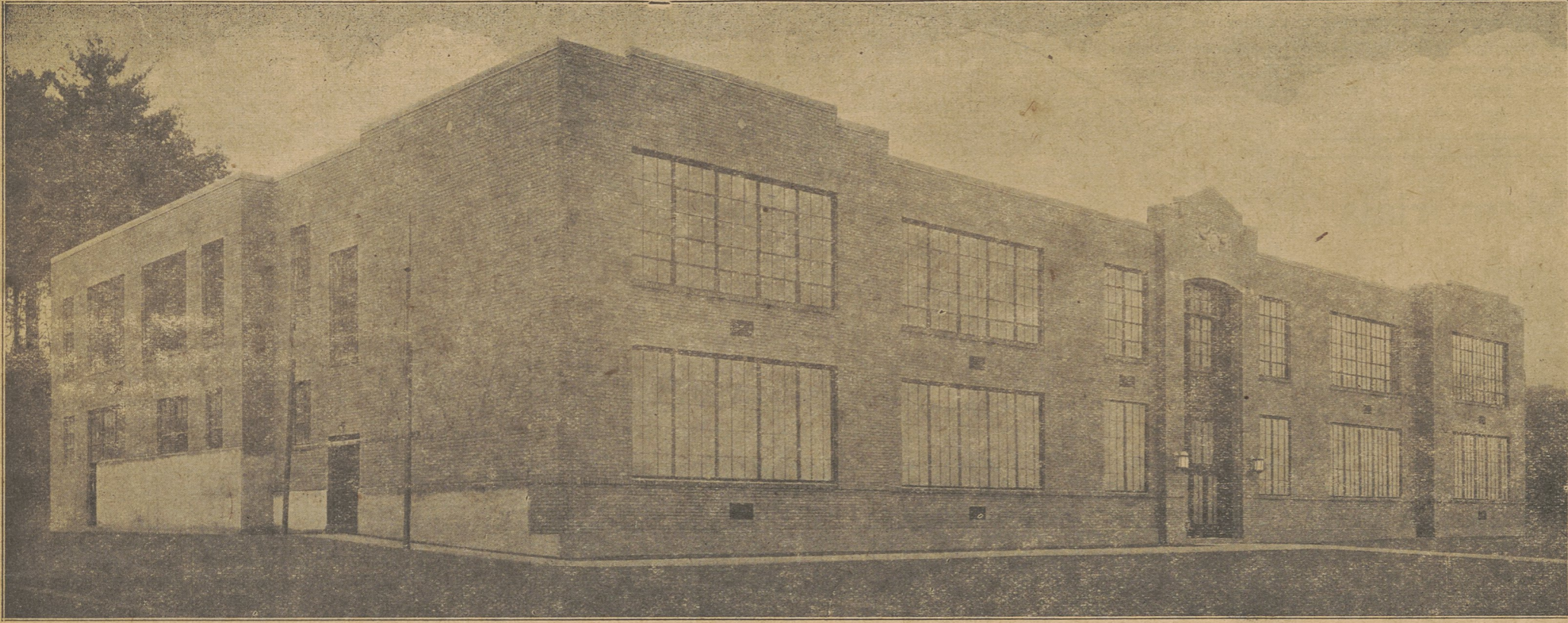

### School Dedication Marks End Of Plans Begun Four Years Ago

#### Directors Deserve Praise For Carrying Projects Through

Kingston township's new high school building, which was dedicated on Wednesday night, represents the realization of plans which have been under consideration for many years and which first reached a definite stage about four years ago.

The question of a new high school was raised on November 6, 1928, when a bond issue for that purpose was defeated at an election. On September 29, 1931, the board passed a resolution authorizing an increase in the bonded indebtedness in the sum of \$85,000. At the election held on November 3, 1931, the increase was ratified overwhelmingly by a vote of 701 to 152.

Estimates for the grading of the property selected ran as high as \$20,000, but, after having tests made, the board was convinced that no unusual conditions existed, and this contention was born out by the contract price of \$4,415 for the grading of the athletic field.

There was a considerable saving effected in issuing serial bonds instead of using a sinking fund method to retire the bonds. The first bonds are to be retired next year upon payment of \$3,500. In each subsequent year as the interest amount is reduced, a larger reduction is made until the last payment will be made in 1947.

#### Building Work At Church Ends

#### Pipe Organ Is Installed; Trucksville People Plan Rededication

Extensive alterations to the building and installation of a large Moeller pipe organ have been completed at Trucksville Methodist Episcopal church, of which Rev. J. Rolland Crompton is pastor. The week of November 13 has been set aside as a time of re-dedication of the church.

The following preliminary program has been announced for the week: Sunday, November 13, Re-dedication Sunday. District Superintendent F. E. Lott to preach. Rev. J. S. Crompton, of Pittston, father of the present pastor, to occupy the pulpit at night. Rev. J. S. Crompton preached the first sermon in the original building when it was built in 1911: Monday night, a service history will be given by Rev. J. L. Thomas, historian, The Church and Its Past; Tuesday night, Epworth League and Young People's night. Rev. G. R. Savage, dean of Sidney Epworth League institute, to speak on The Church and Its Youth; Wednesday night, The Church and Its Fellowship, with a supper by Ladies' Aid society and an evening of informal fellowship; Thursday evening, The Church and Its Spiritual Message, Rev. Dr. L. K. Willman, First Methodist church, Wilkes-Barre; Friday evening, The Church and Its Ministry of Music, organ recital by J. Fowler Richardson, organist, and a concert by St. Stephen's church choir.

#### SEEK OWNER

#### NOTES ON NEW HIGH SCHOOL

It is estimated two mills additional tax will take care of the bond issue of the new school. As the average property is assessed at \$1,200, this amounts to \$2.40 per year or twenty cents a month that the average tax payer will contribute to the new school, the worth of which will be realized, it is expected, by the public use of the school auditorium.

Local labor was used wherever possible on the new school and of the sum of \$20,000 spent for labor, \$14,500 was paid to local taxpayers in return for their services. This gave considerable relief to a number of families in the Kingston township section.

Members of the board of education which deserves the commendation for carrying through the high school project are J. B. Schooley, president; Herbert H. Hill, vice-president; Edwin F. Hay, treasurer; C. Wilbur Nichols, secretary; J. Earl Sewhart.

Music provided at the dedicatory exercises on Wednesday night was exceptional. The high school orchestra and glee club is to be commended highly.

One man who is happy about the new school is Thomas Carle, Jr., supervising principal. Another one is Warren Taylor, high school principal. Members of the high school faculty are Wilson A. Cease, Walter Hicks, Emma Shaver, Hilda Staub, Madge Anderson, Edna Cease and Josie K. Warden.

#### LOCATION OF NEW SCHOOL ATTRACTIVE

The new Kingston township high school building, perched proudly above the buildings and highways of the Trucksville valley, has a natural setting which present an appearance as attractive as any in this section.

It is recalled that considerable difficulty arose in determining the location of the school, and the present site was originally offered at a price of \$21,500, to which amount the Board objected. After extended negotiations repeated conferences, appraisals by expert realtors and even legal entanglements, condemnation proceedings were instituted and the present plot was finally purchased for \$8,750.

The harmonious architecture of the building is accentuated and improved by the natural beauty of the environment.

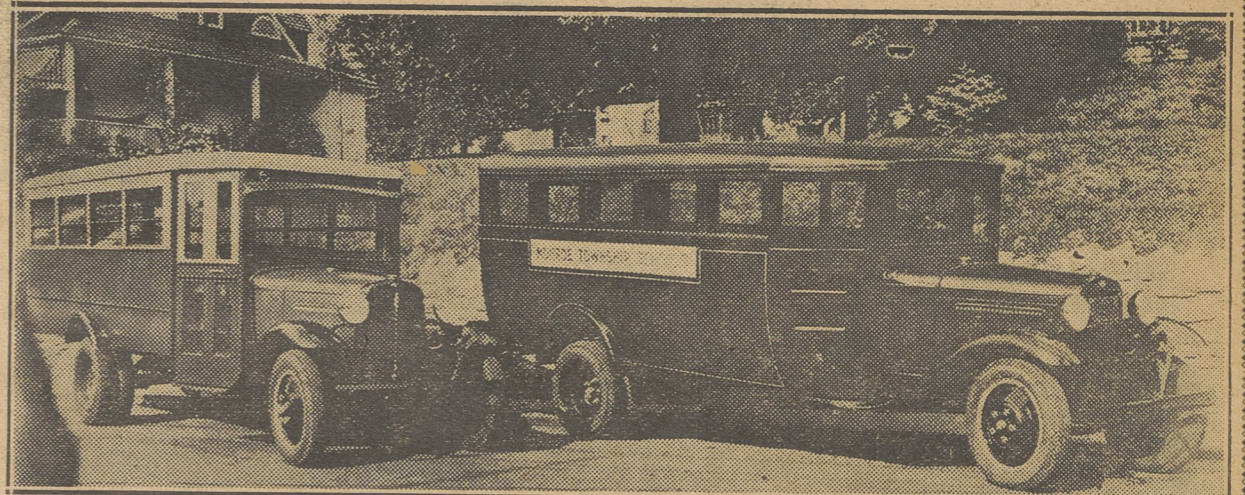
