Property Sold For Taxes

One hundred and two Susquehanna county properties were offered for sale for unpaid taxes recently. Of this number seventy-six were bid in by the county and twenty-six were purchased by individuals. Some of the properties were bid in by speculators, the owners being unable to meet the taxes against them. Other properties would have been sold but ninety-seven property owners have made arrangements for loans or have made part payments on their 1931 taxes, so these sales have been adjourned until October 1. Sale of properties for unpaid taxes are not uncommon in Susquehanna county. Properties usually, however, bring less than the amount of taxes for which they are sold.
