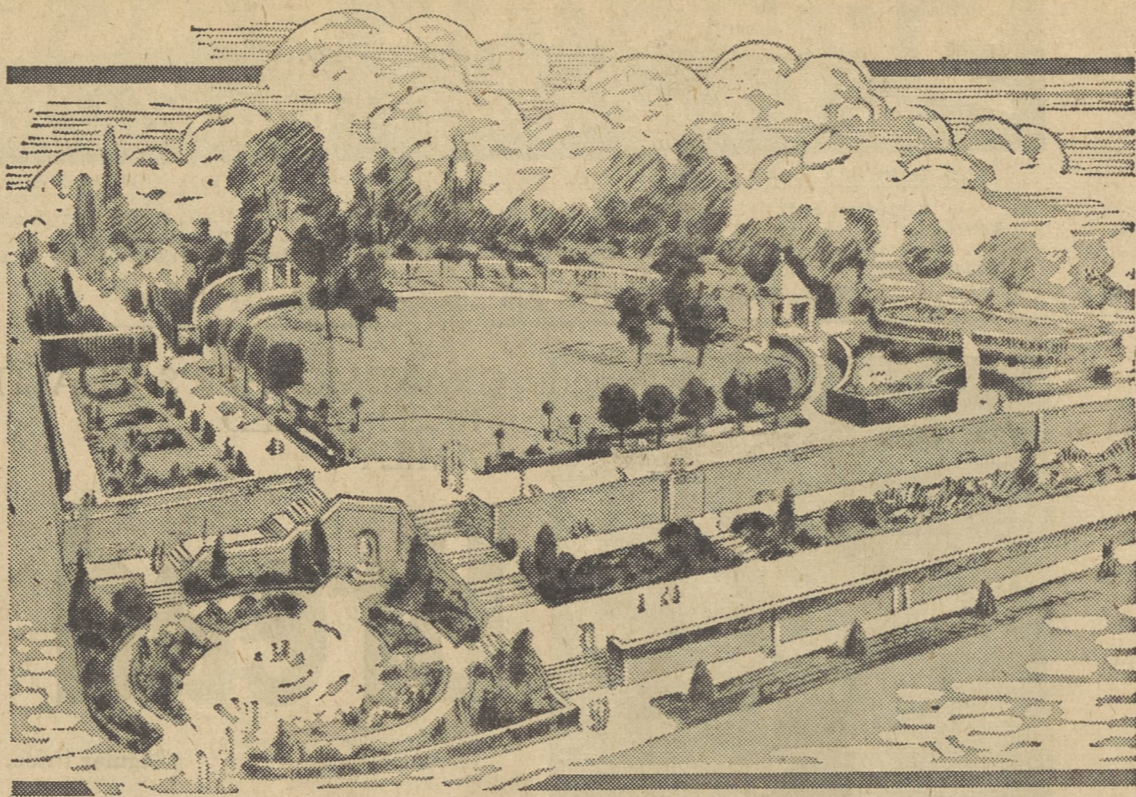

New Beauty Spot for Niagara Falls



ONE of the most attractive outdoor garden theatres in the world is now being constructed by the Niagara Falls, Ontario, Park Commission on a site commanding a complete view of both the American and Horseshoe Falls. The ground, formerly occupied by the famous Clifton House, was donated

to the Commission by Harry Oakes, wealthy mine owner of Toronto, and it links up with the existing park system. More than \$100,000 is to be spent in preparing the property. The garden theatre will be ready by June 1936. Rock gardens, lily ponds, flag-stoned terraces, promenades and expanses of lawn provide

the setting for the open-air stage where plays will be acted and musical entertainment given. These will be sponsored by the Commission and will be open to the public, both residents and visitors alike.
