

## TWENTY MOTOR BOATS EXPECTED TO COMPETE IN SUNDAY'S RACES

MOST THRILLING EVENT OF SEASON SCHEDULED

The most exciting events scheduled yet in Harvey's Lake's summer program of water competitions will take place on Sunday when fast motor boats compete for speed honors here.

The list of entries is not complete yet, since owners probably will continue to enter until Sunday but it is definite that there will be at least twenty boats entered in the spectacular events.

Among the entries in the six-cylinder class are the boats of Lou Baltimore, Dr. Ben Davis, whose boat will be driven by his son, Ben, Jr., Bob Roberts, George Cooper and Emil Rothman.

Buoys have been anchored along a specified course which will permit spectators at almost any section to see the races. A number of the entrants have been practicing along the course daily and the speed displayed already gives indication of a thrilling performance Sunday.

There probably will be six races two for the six-cylinder class and the others for boats of lesser power.

The spirited competition in the water events this summer has attracted increasingly large crowds and officials have been commended for their activity in sponsoring and directing the events.

### Last Sunday's Results

Last Sunday Robert Thomas and Tom Hodorowski captured the honors for the Catholic Boys' Club in winning first and second places in the men's swimming contests at the Picnic Grounds. Jimmie Campbell took a decisive victory over Irvin Roe of Dallas in the swimming and diving contests.

In the girls' contest, Ruth, daughter of Chief of Police Ira C. Stevenson, and Anne and Helen Bixby were tied for first place.

The Y. W. C. A., the Y. M. C. A., the Catholic Boys' Club and neighboring communities were well represented in all contests.

The crowd easily exceeded the 2,000 mark and probably was nearer to 3,000. It was the unanimous opinion of officials and spectators that the event was the best yet this Summer.

### Jumper Injured While Leaping From Runway

Two motorcycle jumps are scheduled at the Harvey's Lake Picnic Grounds for next Sunday. One of the dives will be done by "Cowboy Bill" Hubbard, originator of the jump, and the other by one of Hubbard's troupe. The jumps will take place at two and at seven. Art Giberson will be the new jumper.

In last week's jump, John Bronchick, who jumped for Hubbard, was seriously hurt, receiving a bad gash in his left leg, Bronchick, veteran motorcyclist, was given medical treatment at Wilkes-Barre. Bronchick's wound was sewn by sixteen stitches. He is resting comfortably under the care of his doctor and will come to the Lake next week for a rest.

Hubbard stated that the jumps will go on, regardless of the accident. He hopes to perfect a troupe of four men to travel about the country doing his act. He will remain at Harvey's Lake for the rest of the summer.

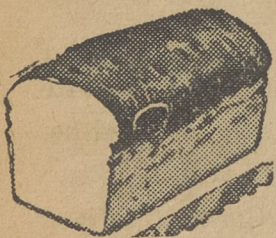
