AN ORDINANCE
An Ordinance Fixing the Tax Levy for the year 1937.

Section 1 Be it enacted and ordained by the Council of the Borough of Dallas and it is hereby enacted and ordained by authority of the same, that the tax levy for the Borough of Dallas for the year from January 1st, 1937 to December 31st, 1937, shall be as follows:

For General Borough Tax, Eleven Mills (.011), For Light Tax, Three Mills (.003), For Sinking Fund Tax, One and One Half Mills (.0015), being One Dollar and Ten Cents for General Borough Tax on each One Hundred Dollars (-100) of assessed valuation of taxable property, a Light Tax of Thirty Cents on each One Hundred Dollars (\$100) of assessed valuation of taxable property, and a Sinking Fund Tax of Fifteen Cents on each One Hundred Dollars (\$100) of assessed valuation of taxable property.
