Richards To Occupy New Marat Building

Will Give Town Semi-Self-Service Market On Main Street

Dan Richards, has leased the new building next to the railroad station on Main street, Dallas, and will open Richards' Economy Market in its modern setting next Thursday morning, he disclosed this week.

Richards has arranged the interior of the building, built by Stanley Marat last year, so that it will be suitable for a semi-half service system. Groceries and fresh produce will line the walls in attractive shelves, and fresh meats and dairy products will be displayed in specially designed electrically refrigerated cases. Dan and three assistants will serve customers.

Floor space amounting to nearly 1,100 square feet will be occupied by the store proper, while the remaining space in the 24x65 foot building has been set aside for storage. The store will have all the modern appointments, including two large Hill refrigerator boxes for meats and dairy products, and a refrigerated show case for meats.

Dan lives with his wife in their Church street home, and has been an employe of the American Stores, Inc., in Dallas for nearly eight years.
