



CAN YOU SOLVE THESE?








CONNECT ALL OF THE DOTS IN THEIR ORDER TO SEE FUNLAND'S BOXING CHAMPION.



SEE HOW NEATLY YOU CAN DRAW IN THE NECESSARY LINES TO COMPLETE THESE PICTURES.






Boo! Hoo! Boo! Hoo!


