Meetings of the Kingston, Dorrance-ton and Forty Fort auxiliaries were held in the afternoon and at each George T. Bell, Jr., spoke on the new Hospital Service Corporation of Northeastern Pennsylvania, explaining its principles and its plan of providing for hospital service on an insurance plan.

This plan has been formulated by the hospitals of Wyoming Valley and eventually will be expanded so it will be available throughout Northeastern Pennsylvania. Both Philadelphia and New York have such hospital insurance plans.
