

QUARTERONIS BREAK RECORD--TEAMS TIED IN SCHOOL LEAGUE

Three-game High Of 2695 Created In Junior League

Records Topple When Quarteroni Kegler's Run Wild At St. John's

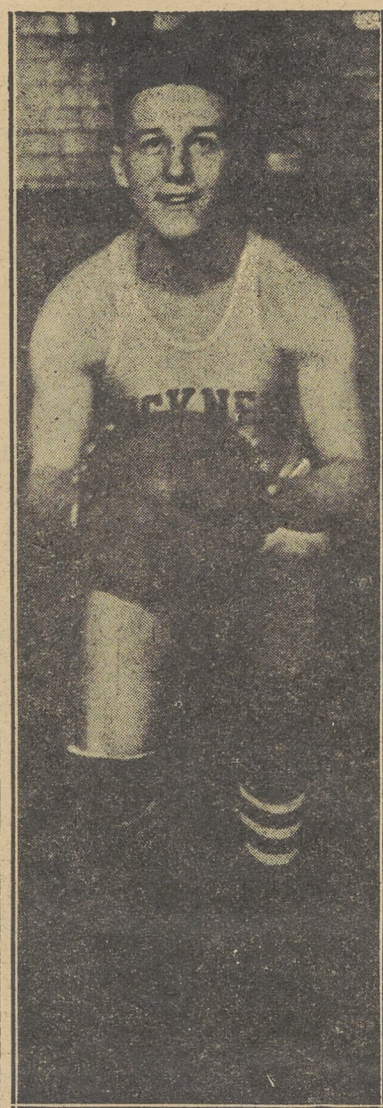
SCHOOL BOND SALE
