Imports Barred By New Rule Of League; Dallas To Play Danville May 15

The signal for this year's local baseball season was sounded yesterday by Don Grose, manager of the Dallas Arrows, who issued a call for all members of last year's team, with the exception of imports, and all candidates for the 1940 team to report for try-outs on the Dallas Township diamond on Sunday afternoon at 2.

The Bi-county League has adopted a rule barring imports so that the local nine will have to rely on talent from its own backyard this summer. The Arrows won the bi-county pennant in 1938 and were runners-up to Carverton, last season's champion, in 1939.

Aside from the regulars, who will be back in Arrows' uniforms this season, there is a quantity of good material waiting to be tested. Some of the players who are expected to strengthen the line-up are Gilbert Husted, Harry Spencer, Bob Wright, Mike Kozemchak, Bernie Wilson, Paul Fiske, Frank Edwards, James Knecht, Lou Reese, Chet Rusiloski and Leo Neizgoda.

After try-outs, the players who measure up will be given regular berths on the squad and will get their uniforms from Manager Grose on the Sunday before the opening game, which will probably be on May 5.
