Oriole Keglers Top Luzerne Entrants In Coast-to-Coast Bowling Classic

Chicago, May 9—Twelve Luzerne five-man teams won places in the \$50,000 Red Crown Handicap Bowling Sweepstakes, officials of the record-breaking coast-to-coast ten-pin classic announced here today.

Best of the Luzerne bowlers was the Larksville Orioles team, rolling on the St. John's Men's Social Club alleys which turned in a score of 10,191 to win 94th place in Section 3 of the Red Crown Sweeps. Section 3 includes Ohio, West Virginia, Virginia, North and South Carolina and all states to the Northwest.

Other Luzerne winners were: St. John's Holy Name team, 131st place, score 10,134; Stegmaiers, 139th place, score 10,124; Luzerne Anthracite Truckers, 189th place, score 10,065; Piledgi Tavern, 195th place, score 10,058; Rahl Market, 264th place, score 10,007; Kelly St. Market, 289th place, score 9,991; Brokenshire's, 383rd place, score 9,946; Bon Ton Men's Shop, 401st place, score 9,934; Mullay Shoe Repair, 554th place, score 9,885; Buddie's Men's Shop, 556th place, score 9,882; Bileggi Cafe, 742nd place, score 9,832.
