### Polisky's Spectacular Catch Highlights Sunday's Crucial Game

Polisky also stretched a three-base hit into a four-bagger when he came home on an error of the Beaumont third baseman, who missed a catch. Danny Rusiloski also was credited with a three-base hit for Dallas.

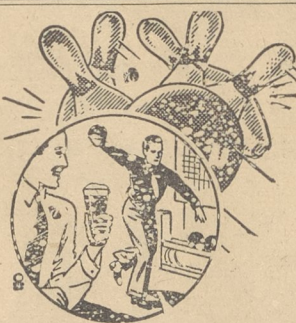
