Board Will Meet On WPA Project

Engineer's Absence Delays Final Motion

Although Kingston Township school board received word at its meeting Monday night that Federal authorities have approved a WPA project for grading and construction of a sewage disposal plant at the Trucksville school no action could be taken because of the absence of the engineer in charge of the work.

The board will invite the engineer to a special meeting which will be called soon to complete plans for the long-awaited project.

A short term loan of \$3,800 was negotiated this week with Luzerne National Bank to pay teachers' salaries. Mrs. Smith, the former Mary Jean Laycock, a commercial teacher, submitted her resignation.

The directors received Tax Collector Harry Bogart's final report on his 1939 duplicate, including a list of persons who had not paid their per capita taxes, making a delinquency of more than \$3,600.
