He resigned in 1923 to accept a similar position with MacWilliams Store, now Pomeroy's. Failing eyesight made it necessary for him to give up accounting and he entered the real estate business in 1929.

His wife, Anna D. Williams, who died three years ago, was the daughter of the late Thomas J. Williams, State Mine Inspector.

Mr. Williams was a member of Memorial Presbyterian church and Kingston Lodge 395, F. & AA. M., whose members will act as pall bearers at the funeral.


